

## **Retail-restaurant roundup: Vegan bakery Cinnaholic coming soon to Tustin; Drybar opens at Spectrum; new Goodwill has one-of-a-kind feature**

### **Vegan sweet rolls coming to Tustin**

Cinnaholic, a gourmet cinnamon roll bakery, is opening Nov. 2 in Tustin.

The ooy-gooy delights come minus any animal products (like eggs, milk and butter), and they're also cholesterol-free.

The bakery at 2423 Park Ave. will be the fifth Cinnaholic location in California. The bakery will be offering cinnamon rolls for only \$1 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on opening day.

The Tustin bakery, owned by franchisee Nik Patel, joins a bevy of Cinnaholic bakeries also in Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Maryland, Florida and Canada.

The company got some national attention when it appeared on ABC's "Shark Tank" in 2014. The company founders and husband-wife team Florian and Shannon Radke initially accepted a \$200,000 investment from shark investor Robert Herjavec. They would later rescind the deal, opting to move into storefronts vs. online sales, Herjavec's strategy for investing.

Cinnaholic began franchising in 2014 and says it has more than 135 units in development including Dallas, El Paso, Texas, and Knoxville, Tenn.
